PLEASE TAKE NOTICE On October 1, 2021, Jersey Central Power & Light Company ("JCP&L" or "Company") filed a Verified Petition for the review and approval of costs incurred for environmental remediation of manufactured gas plant sites pursuant to the Remediation Adjustment Clause ("RAC") of its filed tariff with the New Jersey Board of Public Útilities ("Board" or "BPÚ"), under BPU Docket No. ER21101155, together with supporting attachments ("Verified Petition").

The Verified Petition seeks reconciliation of the actual costs and collections during 2020 under the RAC, which is a component of the Societal Benefits Charge of JCP&L's filed tariff. The Verified Petition also provides for an assessment of the need for changes in the level of collections under the RAC. JCP&L is requesting to increase collections under Rider RAC, which funds the remediation of former manufactured gas plant sites, by approximately \$1.957 million annually. The Company proposed that the change in rates would become effective on January 1, 2022, or on such date as the Board may determine.

The annual percentage change in rates, if any, will vary according to the applicable rate schedule and the level of the customer's usage. The Board, in its discretion, may apply all or any portion of a rate adjustment to

excess Zero Emissions Certificate Recovery Charge ("ZEC Charge") collections over a 12-month period commencing January 1, 2022, via the Zero Emissions Certificate Reconciliation Charge ("ZECRC") for the Energy Year 2021. The Company is also proposing a change in the ZECRC to adjust the refund of

excess collections from Energy Year 2021. As a result of this adjustment, the proposed ZECRC would increase from (\$0.000158) per kilowatt-hour (w/o Sales and Use Tax ("SUT")) to (\$0.000089) per kilowatt-hour (w/o SUT). Because the 2021 ZECRC refund rate is less than the 2020 ZECRC refund rate, customers' bills will increase.

The approximate effect of the proposed changes on monthly electric bills for residential customers with various usage, as well as class average per customers for all rate classes, if approved by the Board, is illustrated in the table below.
